

Guidelines for Supplying Contributions for Publication within the Series *Instrumenta Patristica et Mediaevalia*

1. Title of the Article: in 14 pt, in lower case

Maurice de Sully, l'évêque de Paris (1160-1196), le prédicateur

2. Author of the Article: forename(s) in normal type followed by surname in small capitals (12 pt), followed by city of residence, italicized between parentheses (in 11 pt)

Jean LONGÈRE
(*Paris*)

3. Text of the Article:

(a) main body of the text: in 12 pt

- Words from a foreign language should be represented in italics (unless they are part of a quotation or citation).
- Diacritics on foreign words should be added for capital letters also: e.g.: ‘À la suite de ...’
- Centuries should be written in complete words and not abbreviated: ‘twelfth century’
- Use regular capitals for Roman numerals, such as: Henry IV
- Supply forenames for people referred to in the text
- Titles of works cited within the text should be italicised
- Do not insert blank lines between paragraphs
- Use the (‘) apostrophe instead of (‘)

(b) subdivisions of the article:

- first level (if necessary, with Arabic numbering): bold, aligned left

1. La tradition manuscrite du recueil latin ‘ad populum’

- second level: italicized and indented

a. *L'imitation du Christ*

(c) long quotations within the text: in 11 pt, normal font, indented; surrounded by double inverted commas

Chaque chrétien porte un luminaire d'autant plus grand qu'il a une foi plus parfaite au Christ et qu'il exerce les bonnes œuvres avec plus de dévouement et de perfection à cause de sa charité, un cierge d'autant plus petit qu'il a une connaissance et une piété plus faibles.

For a quotation within a quotation use single inverted commas (‘ ’) (and not ' '). To indicate that you have introduced a break in the text use [...]. Indicate characters that have been introduced or replaced with chevrons (<>).

(d) texts that are edited and presented in an appendix: in 11 pt

4. Footnotes: in 10 pt, at the foot of the page

5. Bibliographical Citations:

Monograph: Initial(s) of the author's forename(s), Surname (in small capitals), *Title and Subtitle of the Work* (in italics), Place of Publication, Year of Publication, page (pp.)

Article in a Periodical: Initial(s) of the author's forename(s), Surname (in small capitals), "Article title" (within double inverted commas), *Periodical Title* (in italics), volume number (in Arabic numbering) Year of Publication (within parentheses and without a preceding commas), pages (pp.)

H. PIRENNE, "De l'état des laïques à l'époque mérovingienne", *Revue Bénédictine*, 46 (1934), pp. 165-177.

Article in a Miscellany Volume: Initial(s) of the author's forename(s), Surname (in small capitals), "Article title" (within double inverted commas), followed by in, *Title of Publication* (in italics), followed by ed. by Initial(s) of the author's forename(s), Surname (in small capitals), Place of Publication, Year of Publication, page (pp.)

Encyclopaedia Entry: Initial(s) of the author's forename(s), Surname (in small capitals), "Entry title" (within double inverted commas), followed by in, *Title of Publication* (in italics), followed by ed. by Initial(s) of the editor's forename(s), Surname (in small capitals), volume or tome number if applicable (in Arabic numbering), Place of Publication, Year of Publication, page (pp.)

J. ROSSIAUD, "Sexualité", in *Dictionnaire raisonné de l'Occident médiéval*, ed. by J. LE GOFF, J.-C. SCHMITT, Paris, 1999, pp. 1067-1083.

Miscellany Volume: For citing a miscellany volume follow this example:
